

St Andrew's Anglican Church, Alvie

St Andrew's Church at Alvie is the youngest of the parish's three churches, but is still more than 125 years old. St Andrew's was built in 1895 on land donated by Andrew and Elizabeth Murray of Wool Wool Station. Throughout its existence St Andrew's has served Alvie and other nearby villages on the eastern banks of Lake Corangamite, having in the past served as the Parish Church of the Parish of Beec and Alvie and later the Parish of Corangamite. While smaller than both Ss. Johns' Colac and Christ Church Birregurra, St Andrew's nevertheless bears the marks of being a much loved and cared for spiritual home of many generations of Anglicans in the district; in particular boasting beautiful stained glass windows.
